### US election 2016: All you need to know

#### **In January 2017, the most powerful nation on earth will have a new leader, after a drawn out and expensive campaign - but how does a US presidential election work?**

When the US picks its president, it is not only choosing a head of state but a head of government and a commander-in-chief of the largest military on the planet. It's a big responsibility. So how does the process work?

#### **Who can be president?**

To run for president, you only need to be "a natural born" US citizen, at least 35 years old, and have been a resident for 14 years. One person \* is **nominated** to represent the Republican and Democratic parties in the presidential election.

#### **Why is it Hillary Clinton v Donald Trump?**

There is a long and **complex** process for picking a presidential nominee. A series of elections are held in every state and overseas territory, starting in February, which **determine** who becomes each party's official presidential candidate. The candidates are formally confirmed in July at the party conventions. Democrat Hillary Clinton and Republican Donald Trump were the clear winners in 2016. They are two of the most unpopular candidates in modern American history.

#### **The big talking points of the campaign**

There \*has been a **slew of** controversies generated by Donald Trump, from the moment the New York businessman **launched** his campaign with the description of Mexican immigrants as "rapists and criminals". His candidacy has rarely gone a few weeks without **\*\*sparking some uproar**. He's also had to defend his refusal not to release his tax returns plus **field** questions surrounding his charitable foundation.

Hillary Clinton has had her share of **anxious** moments, too. The damage wrought by her private email arrangement to her reputation is thought to be significant. Questions have also been raised about the foreign donations to the Clinton Foundation.

#### **The two big October surprises**

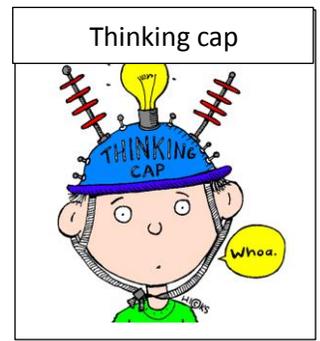
The biggest bombshell **\*\*to jolt** the Trump campaign came on 7 October with the publication of a video from 2005 in which he refers to women in sexually offensive terms. The furore forced him to issue an apology. Then, just 11 days before election day, the FBI announced it had found more emails "**pertinent**" to the Clinton email investigation.

#### **When does the new president start work?**

Votes are cast on **Tuesday, 8 November**, but under the US constitution, the president is not inaugurated until 20 January of the year following the election.

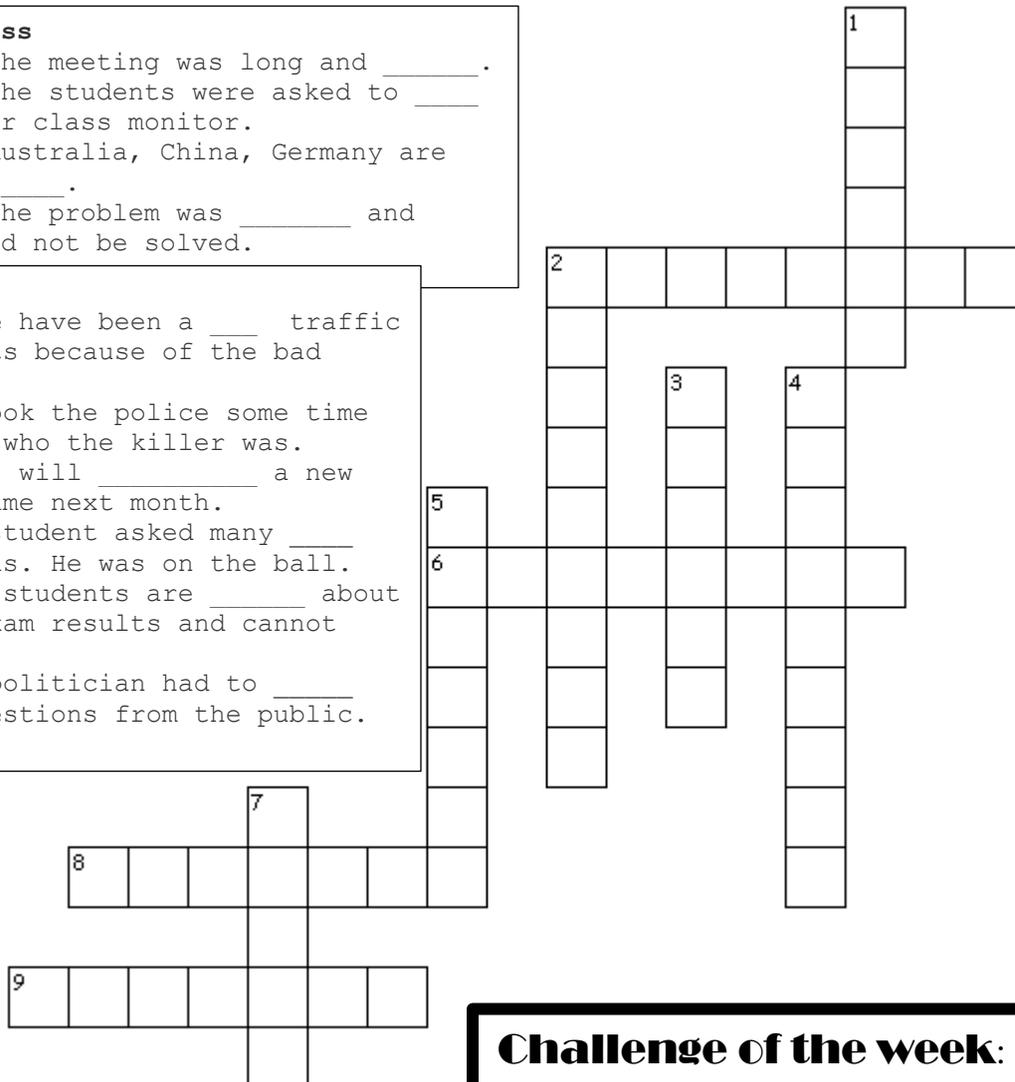
