Important note: Students must be familiar with the features of each genre. With story writing, students must be able to include key elements of stories which include the following: *plot, setting, character(s), point of view, tone, conflict, exposition, rising action, complication, climax, falling action & resolution.* Use of dialogue is essential to moving the story on. Other features to enhance your standard of writing include the following: *foreshadowing, a twist or red herrings*.
